

Barn Manager Intern Job Description

Job: Barn Manager Intern is a seasonal summer position only. Camp Marshall Barn interns are responsible for helping ensure the daily care needed of all horses, helping with campers as needed and following the opportunity to shadow the barn manager and equine director to see what working in the equine industry can be like. If you've ever wanted to learn the ins and outs of barn management, running a facility or gain more knowledge of daily care and maintenance of horses this is your chance. **Note - Admin has the right to change or alter this job description as they see fit at their discretion.**

Job Responsibilities:

- Work closely with the Barn/Assistant Manager/Equine Director
- Help to ensure a safe and fun learning environment for campers
- Help ensure a safe and clean environment for horses and campers
- Assist with daily care of horses (stall/paddock cleaning, feedings, turn out etc.)
- Communicate to Barn/Assistant Manager/Equine Director as needed
- Communicate with other staff and directors as needed
- Ensure that all barn related areas are kept cleanly and presentable at all times
- Be vigilant of potential equipment issues, safety hazards in/out of the rings, or other potential environmental concerns, report issues as needed to the Equestrian Director
- Other duties as assigned by Barn/Assistant Manager/Equestrian Director/Admin Team

Job Requirements:

- Must be 14 years of age or older
- Pass a CORI/SORI/NSOR provided by Camp
- Must be CPR/First Aid certified (Camp can provide if not currently certified)
- Be able to lift approximately 50 pounds
- Previous horse experience a plus but not required
- Some weekends (not all) may be required for limited horse care
- Must have appropriate shoes on at all times to be in the farm/barn area and around a variety of animals. Paddock boots, work boots or muck boots are accepted. Sneakers, sandals, flip flops or crocs are not allowed at any time in the barn area
- Physical endurance to be on one's feet walking, crouching, bending, twisting, reaching above head, and be physically active for a prolonged period of time
- Follow all Camp Marshall policies and procedures at all times
- Attend all staff training (provided by Camp)
